We are looking for a new committee member who meet the following criteria:

- Hematology Researcher (fundamental/basic or translational research) specializing in non-malignant hematology with a focus on erythropoiesis/ hemoglobinopathies and iron metabolism;
- Established group leader;
- Successful in securing research funding;
- Enthusiastic about supporting hematology research in Europe;
- Mentoring experience (demonstrable track record as mentor).

Workload:

The majority of the workload for the committee is centered around the review and selection of grants winners as well as the review of progress reports:

A rough timeline of commitments for the selection of EHA grant application winners is below:

- *September*: Review of Kick-off Grant applications
- *November*: 3-hour call to select Kick-off Grant winners
- *November-January*: Preliminary review of Research Grant and Bilateral Collaborative Grant applications
- *February*: 3-hour video conference to shortlist Research Grant and Bilateral Collaborative Grant applicants for external review
- *March*: Review of Innovation Grant applications
- *Mid-April*: Evaluation of external review feedback for 30+ applications
- *April*: 3-hour conference call to shortlist Research Grant candidates for interviews
- *April*: 3-hour conference call to select Bilateral Collaborative Grant and Innovation Grant winners
- *Mid-May*: 3-day attendance of the interview meeting at the EHA office in the Hague

Review Grantee Reports

- One interim report per month (on average)
- One final report per month (on average)

Appointment: for 3 years in the first instance.
