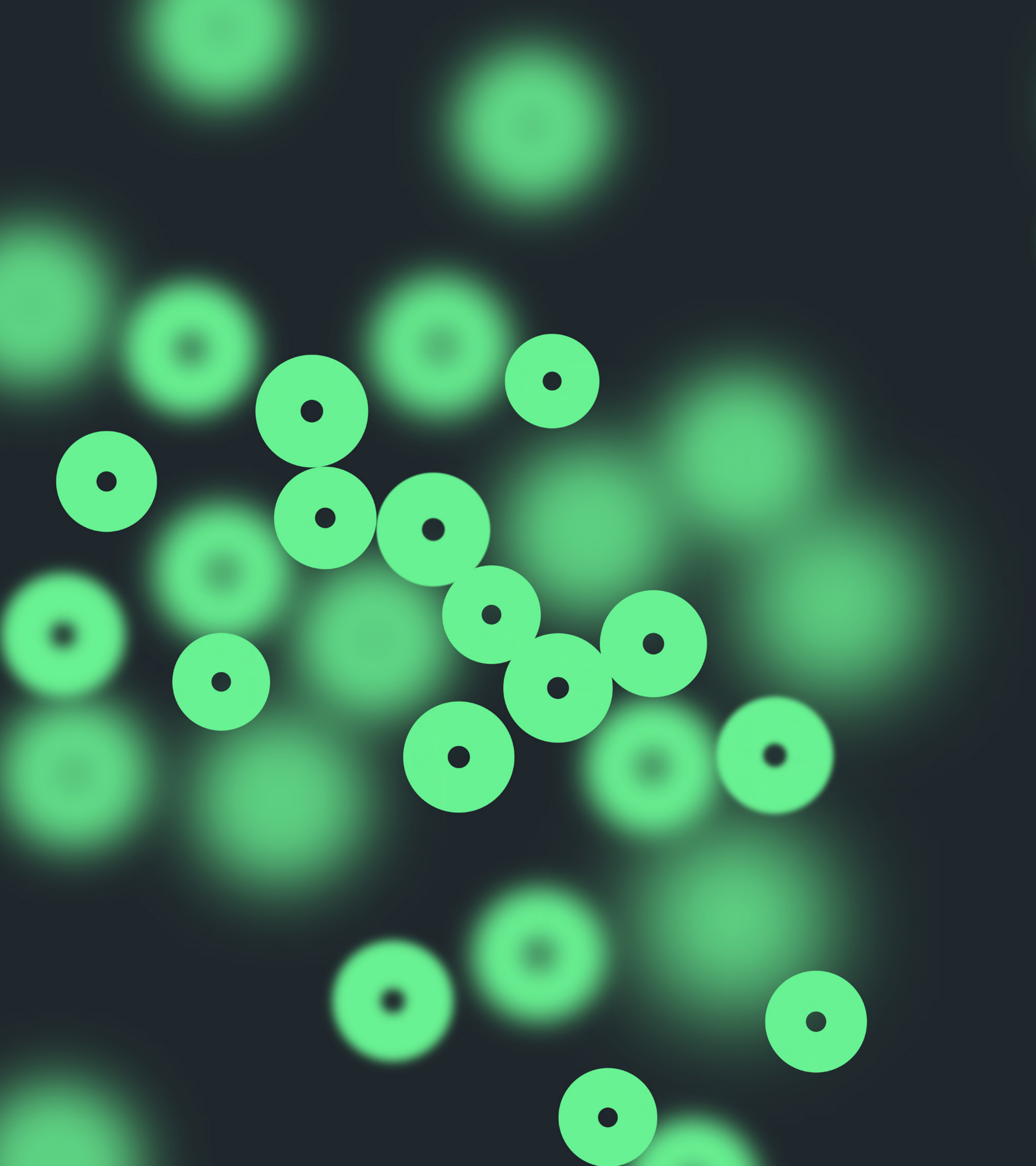

A specialty with few professional opportunities

FALSE: Hematology is a specialty with a high demand and labor projection, both in the public and private sectors. Hematologists can work in hospitals, health centers, blood banks, clinical laboratories, research, or teaching centers. We also collaborate with other medical specialties for advice/support.

A boring and monotonous specialty

FALSE: Hematology is a dynamic, varied specialty requiring updated knowledge of diseases, laboratory techniques, and therapies while fostering rewarding human and professional relationships with patients and families.

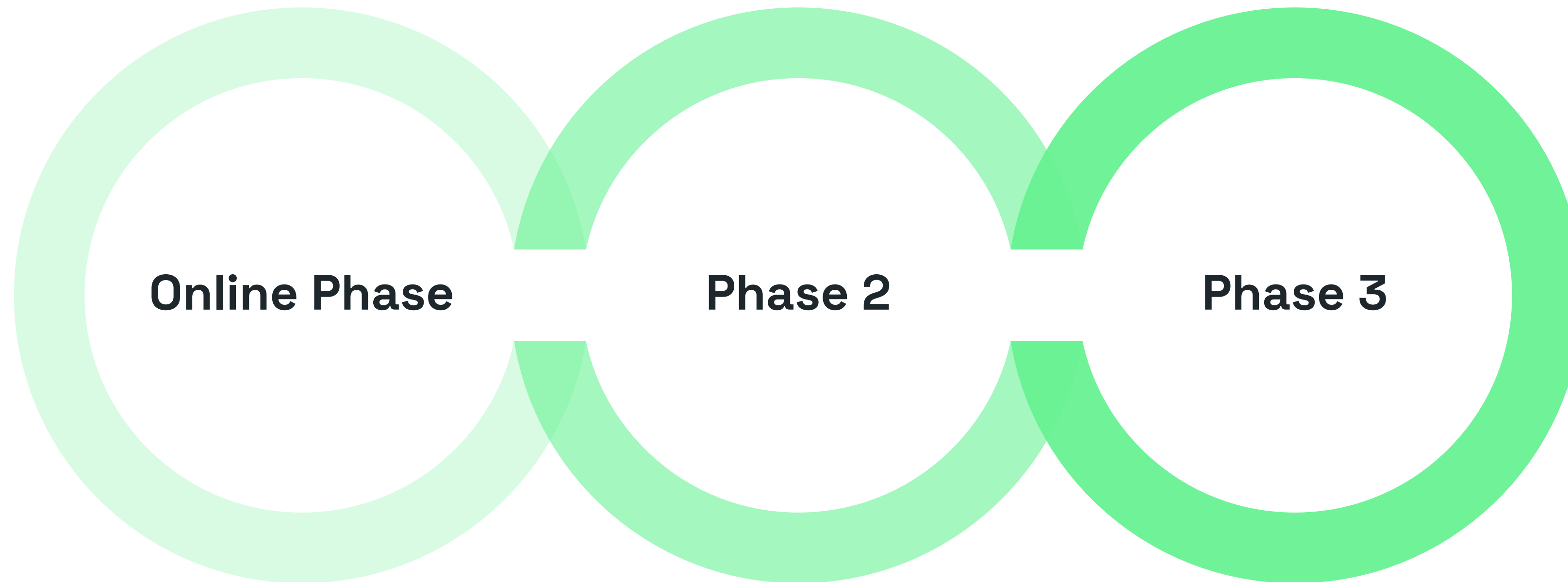
It is a difficult and complex specialty

- Creating long-lasting relationships with peers

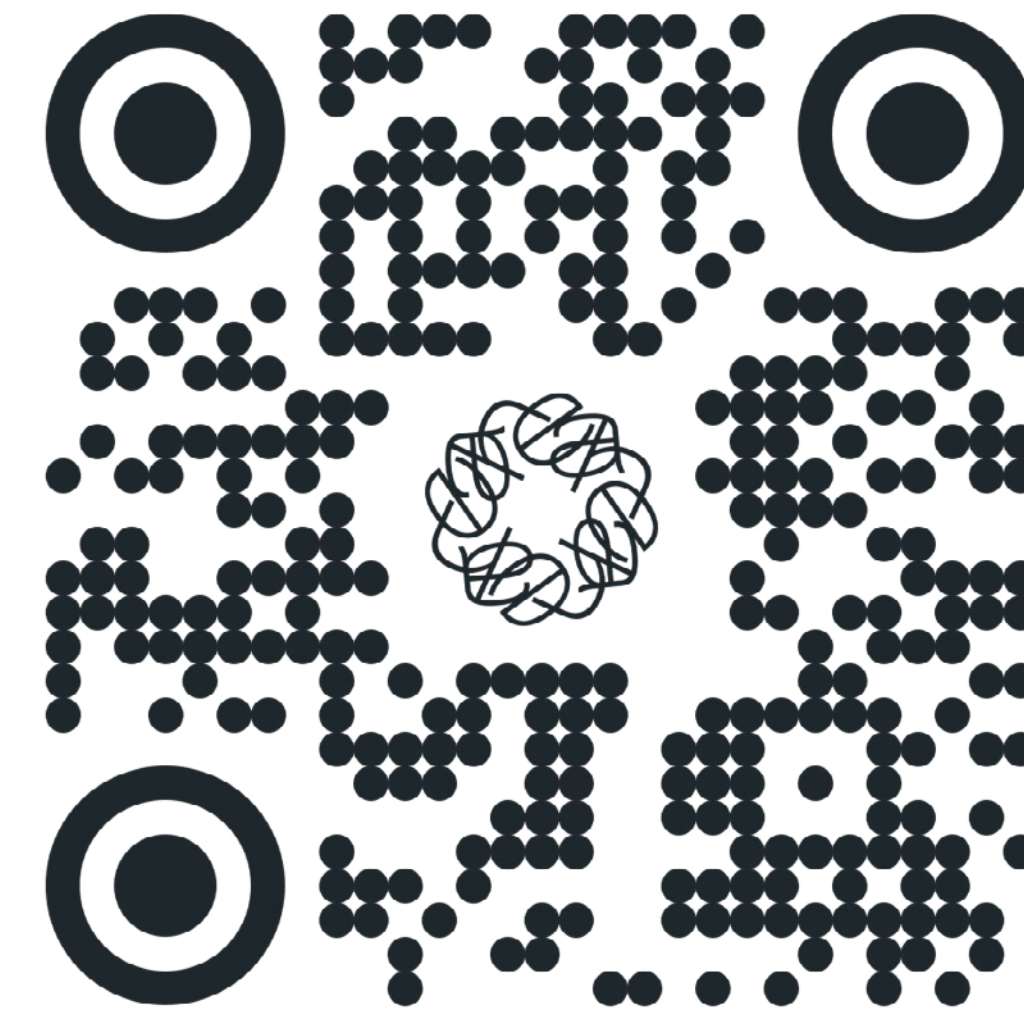
Participants in phase 3 will further their study of hematology in a second retreat:
