The Fellowships & Grants Committee is responsible for assigning EHA funding to talented researchers. We are looking for Fellowships & Grants Committee members who meet the following criteria:

- Hematology researcher (fundamental/basic or translational research).
- Established group leader.
- Successful in securing research funding.
- Enthusiastic about supporting hematology research in Europe.
- Mentoring experience (demonstrable track record as mentor).

Hematology researchers specializing in Genomics, Epigenetics, Thalassemia, Thrombosis, hemostasis, normal stem cell biology, CLL, Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, Multiple Myeloma, Infections in Hematology, Bioinformatics, Biostatistics, Pediatric Bone Marrow Transplantation, are especially encouraged to apply.

Eligible hematology researchers from countries not currently represented on the committee are particularly encouraged to apply. Please see current members [here](#).

Workload:

Majority of the workload for the committee is centered around the review and selection of grants winners as well as the review of reports as follows:

Review and select applicants' applications winners for EHA grants and fellowships:

- Jan-Feb: around 2 weeks to preliminary review 30+ applications for research grants
- Feb- 3-hour video conference to shortlist applicants for external review
- End of March: 1 day for interviewing candidates for the Bilateral Collaborative Grants
- Mid-April: evaluate external review feedback for 30+ applications
- End of April: 3-hour conference call to short-list interview candidates
- Mid May: 3-day attendance of the interview meeting in the Netherlands.
- End of September: Review of up to twenty applications for Kick-off Grants and Bilateral Collaborative Grants
- End of Nov: 3-hour calls to shortlist external review candidates for the Bilateral Collaborative Grants
- End of Nov: 3-hour call to select winners for the Kick-off Grants

Review Grantee Reports:

- One interim report a month on average
- One final report a month on average

Reviewing Research Mobility Grants:

Approximately two simple applications (max four pages) a month for the Research Mobility Grants

Appointment: for 3 years.
